

#6 ASKING QUESTIONS

A reference card to support your teaching approach...

ASK EVERYONE: Ask-Pause-Request All

- Start with an easy low stakes question, ask questions, pause, then request a response from all.
- Use questions that have no wrong answer and everyone can respond to.

THINK-PAIR-SHARE: Ask-Pair-Peer Dialogue

- For challenging questions get learners to come up with answers individually, then get them to work in pairs to share their views.
- Try saying - "think about this challenge for a moment individually, then discuss with a partner".

TAKING VOLUNTEERS: Ask-Pause-Self Select

- When asking learners to volunteer an answer, pause and hold the silence. If nothings coming rephrase and wait.
- "Use phrases like..."Who wants to share their thoughts?"or"how might we..."
